The UNA, a program of the UN Foundation, is a grassroots member organization that mobilizes Americans to support the principles and work of the UN. UNA-USA has a national network of 125 chapters, and is the largest network of advocates and supporters of the UN in the world. Membership to UNA-USA is your connection to the UN.

Our Westchester Chapter is involved in public programs such as the UN Day event on October 26, 2014 at the YWCA in White Plains, NY and the International Women's Day program on March 8, 2015 that seek to engage local citizens, especially young people, in the work of the UN and its partners. We also deliver educational programs about the UN for third graders in Yonkers and for high school students in Mount Vernon. In 2014 we supported the Westchester Model UN Conference in Hastings, UN Clubs in Sleepy Hollow and Mount Vernon, and the Model UN training program at Mercy College.

As active members of UNA-USA, Young Professionals are committed to fostering international cooperation and community education on international affairs. Young Professional groups work locally throughout the United States to promote and implement education projects, advocate for a strong US-UN relationship, and participate in professional development opportunities.
